within environmental intervention projects

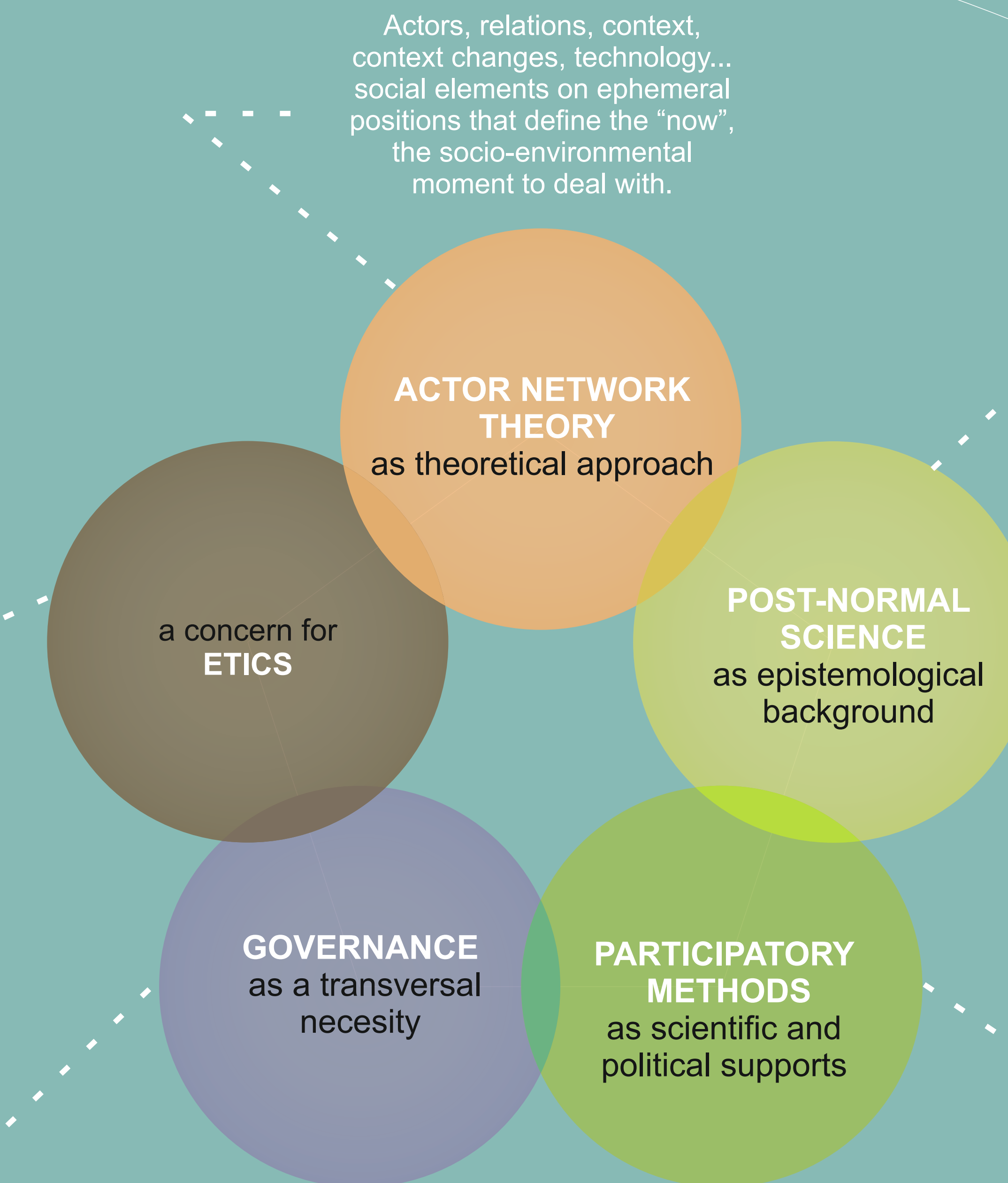
